The Child and Family Mental Health Program provides mental health services for children, families, and caregivers. We believe that therapy is a process devoted to growth and change, where family involvement is vital. Our highly knowledgeable and trained therapists provide child and family therapy using a strength-based, client-centered approach with a strong reliance on cognitive behavioral and solution focused family therapy, behavior management training, and play therapy. Supervision is provided by Licensed Mental Health Clinicians.

HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILD NEEDS MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES?

If you notice that your child is withdrawing, acting out, or experiencing frequent fear, it may be time to seek help.

HOW DO I KNOW IF I QUALIFY FOR SERVICES?

This program specifically targets children from birth to 17 years old. Teenagers 14 years and older can receive services without family involvement, although family involvement is encouraged.
