CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

The Willamette Family Child Development Center (CDC) is licensed by the Child Care Division of the State of Oregon and is the only program of its kind in Lane County. Inclusive classrooms offer a nurturing environment and are designed to address the developmental and specific needs of children from 6 weeks through 6 years old within their specific age group. The CDC is accessible to parents who are participating in Willamette Family services.
